EXCUSE ME Receives WIFV Narrative Short Finishing Fund Grant

Written and produced by **Mary Beth Warner**, EXCUSE ME, tells the story of Amanda Firth, a woman in her 50s, facing the challenge of finding a new job at a time when she is becoming increasingly invisible in daily life. The script was a finalist in last year's WIFV Narratve Short Screenplay Competition. The short



FORAGER on MPT - October 13 & 17

FORAGER is a glimpse into the life path of James Beard-nominated Chef Chris Amendola, who is known for using foraged and seasonal-only items to create culinary brilliance. A creative force in the Baltimore restaurant world, Chris navigated through a turbulent youth and then honed his craft, only to launch a popular new eatery a few short years before the Covid shutdown. This documentary is a story of seeking, resilience, resolve, and how a true passion can save one's life. It will premiere on Maryland Public Television on Sunday, Oct. 13 at 6:30 pm and then on MPT2 Oct. 17 at 10:30 pm. It will then find a home on PBS digital online. More info here.

Directed by **Renee Fischer**, this is the latest film from Spring and Fall Productions which is dedicated to creating documentaries which highlight our commonality and shine a spotlight on issues of social concern.
