Here are just a few examples: **Mentorship** – The WIFV Mentorship program pairs WIFV members with seasoned industry experts. Although the mentees must be members, the mentors do not need to be. If you missed your opportunity to serve as a mentor, we have a waiting list of mentees who we may be able to pair with you.

Fiscal Sponsorship – Our Fiscal Sponsorship program allows qualifying independent film productions to receive tax-deductible contributions and to solicit and receive grants available only to organizations with a 501(c)3 IRS designation, like WIFV. Few Seed Funds exist for documentary filmmakers. WIFV understands the importance of first-in support and is grateful for

the many contributions it has received from its members to support this program. In addition to a grant of \$2,500, WIFV will offer a mentoring component with accomplished WIFV members, provide access to the Executive Director and her knowledge of resources, and bring the power of our programming events and workshops to address key education needs. Student projects are not eligible for this grant. Only current WIFV members may apply. You will receive the link to the application form in your registration confirmation. More info and apply here.

Fiscal Sponsorship - April 21

Program Eligibility Requirements

Applications will be accepted from current WIFV members only. WIFV supports fiscally sponsored projects that are consistent with our IRS-approved mission. Eligible projects for fiscal sponsorship must meet one or both of the following criteria:

--Film and media projects that feature women in key, above-the-line roles (specifically: producer, director, writer, editor or director of photography); or

--Film and media projects whose subject matter informs and features women's experiences or points of view.

If a member's project is selected for fiscal sponsorship, they must remain a WIFV member in good standing for the duration of the project. The Luthier by Jon Adelman - The Luthier: The Ballad of Amnon Weinstein lyrically explores a master craftsman's lifelong dedication to restoring violins, including the world famous collection of Holocaust violins known as the Violins of Hope, which would become his passion, his obsession, and ultimately his legacy.

The Art of Scars by Jess Walters follows artist Jess Walters through kidney failure, dialysis, and transplant, highlighting the interdependence of human health. After being diagnosed with End-Stage Renal Disease, Walters brought their disabled and recovering body into arts spaces, challenging stigmas that deem chronically ill and disabled lives unfulfilling, unpretty, or unworthy. Featuring Walters and their living donor, Charles Nichols, the film reveals the hidden realities of surgery and recovery. Sharing the stories of their scars, Walters invites viewers to confront taboos and recognize the universality of their experience.
